As of May 2025, over 42 million suspicious emails have been reported to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service, resulting in the removal of 400,000 scam websites by the NCSC. "Good to hear from you, here is what I want you to do for me because I'm a little busy right now, conflicting priorities, I'm only available here for now. I have been working on incentives and I aimed at surprising some of our diligent staff with gift cards this week. This should be confidential until they all have the gift cards as it's a surprise. Can you get this done remotely and how soon?

Please be extra vigilant and don't respond to emails like these!

EVERYDAY FAITH





Living with dementia at any time brings challenges.

The Alzheimer's Society are working towards a world where dementia no longer devastates lives. They do this by giving help to those living with dementia today, and providing hope An Alzheimer's Society initiative for the future.

As part of the action plan for our Benefice Churches for Dementia Friendly Church it has been suggested we publish monthly in our newsletters information which offers help in what 'not' to say to someone living with Dementia. We will be using information from the Alzheimers association website.

Things to avoid saying to somebody with dementia

3. Consider whether to remind the person of a death: 'Your brother died 10 years ago' A person living with dementia may forget about a past bereavement or ask for somebody who has died. Reminding them of a loved one's death can be very painful, and they may react as though hearing the news for the first time all over again.

How to respond to these types of difficult questions will vary for different people in different circumstances, however, it's always important to show sensitivity and minimise any distress.

Try this instead:

For some people, encouraging them to talk about the person they are asking about can be comforting. Distraction techniques can be useful, although try not to avoid the question if they keep asking, as this can cause the person to feel more anxious.

Find out how the person is feeling, sometimes asking about a particular family member or friend is due to the person having an unmet need, such as wanting comfort or reassurance.

EMERGENCY ALERTS TEST

The test will function like a real life Emergency Alert on all 4G and 5G phone networks in the UK. Your mobile or tablet does not have to be connected to mobile data or wifi to get alerts.

Devices will vibrate and make a loud siren sound for roughly 10 seconds. A test message will also appear on screens.

The message will say "This is a test of Emergency Alerts, a UK Government service that will warn you if there is a life-threatening emergency nearby. You do not need to take any action. In a real emergency, follow the instructions in the alert to keep yourself and others safe."






It started with Hello.....

People are used to receiving messages from unknown numbers, but this "Hello" could be the start of a scam.

Any response, from "?????" "Wrong number" or another simple "hello" verifies to the scammer that your phone number is active. From here the scam could go on to impersonate Police or the Bank, inform you owe a parking fine, be the start of a romance fraud, to name just a few of the many, many other ways of manipulating you into giving away sensitive personal or banking information.



And as a bonus if you do reply, expect more text messages from random numbers in the future.

So what should you do?

- Do not reply.
- Do not click on any links.
- Forward the message to 7726 along with the number the text came from.
- Delete and block the number.
- If you have given any personal information report the incident to Action Fraud via their website or by calling 0300 123 2040 and if you have given any financial information inform your bank immediately.


